	Injury/damage due to RCV movement while operating bin lift	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Use of working camera to check area is clear before moving ● No loading waste while the vehicle is moving or reversing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All residents will be instructed to stand clear whilst the RCV's packer is in use. ● No residents will be allowed to operate the bin lifts or RCV packer as they are not trained to do so. ● The driver is only present to operate the vehicle and it's controls. Residents are required to load waste into the vehicle themselves unless a wheeled bin is used, in which case the driver will operate the lifting equipment.
